COURSES	
Language of teaching	French and English (all schools have courses in both languages - except for BBA and EMBA programs: only English). French knowledge is not mandatory, students can have all courses taught in English.  No English proficiency test is required for exchange students.
Foreign language courses	French language courses are available for exchange students (3 levels: beginner, intermediate, advanced).  Foreign language courses are available for students staying the whole academic year only (October - July): Italian, German, Hebrew, Chinese, German, Spanish.
Fields of study	International business, Communication, Finance, Management Courses from 1 <sup>st</sup> to 5 <sup>th</sup> year Exchange students can mix languages / years / schools / programs.

## **ACCOMMODATION**

## **FLAT EXCHANGE**

A "flat exchange" service puts in relation the international incoming students with the French outgoing students who can rent them their apartment or room.

Once we receive the registration file, we send the student the information and the flat offers.

Shuttle to Paris: 13 euros (to Porte Maillot)

The incoming and outgoing students are in direct contact and PGSM cannot be responsible for conditions, contracts, prices, cancelations. The International Office just puts the students in contact.

# **EGIDE**

Egide is an institution depending from the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs and launched a program to welcome the international students in Paris. They created 2 packages providing services to students to prepare their arrival.

The first package costs between 250 and 660 euros depending on the length of stay and inlcudes:

- provided accomodation in a student residence in Paris or its nearest suburbs

(excludes rents - several options will be proposed and the room of your choice will be booked by Egide. No



## guarantor will be asked)

The second package costs 1090 euros and includes:

- provided accomodation in a student residence in Paris or its nearest suburbs (excludes rents)
- assistance to prepare the arrival and the settlement
- transfer from the airport to the residence
- assistance with the residence permit procedures
- insurance contract for civil responsibility and repatriation

## **HOME STAYS**

One of the easiest and flexible options for accommodation in Paris, as there's no need to have any guarantor; it's safe, comfortable, quick to find with an immediate and permanent service in case of problems.

The International Office can put you in contact with several good and serious agencies.

Various types of stays are offered (with / without meals or breakfast, per week or month) and starts from 600 euros.

## **RESIDENCES**

Students can contact the Cité Universitaire Internationale where they can have a room in one of their International Houses - http://www.ciup.fr/room\_cite.htm

They can also contact the private student residences within Paris and close suburbs. A list can be asked to the International Office.

Monthly rents vary from 550 to 1000 euros for a single room / studio.

Students without guarantor may be asked to pay the totality of the semester rents in advance if you don't contact Egide.

## **RENTING A FLAT IN PARIS**

Montly rent in Paris goes from 400 to 1200 euros for a single room / studio.

In general, to rent a place via private owners, guarantors who live in France are usually requested, in addition to a security deposit (one or two month rents amount).

Announces can be found on internet and via real estate agencies.

Flat sharing is very common in France and specialized internet sites are numerous (search for "colocation").
