About the lecture

There are several disregarded empirical issues in the pension area that call for review of the current pension scheme(s) design and that may move the discussion beyond the typical funded/unfunded policy controversy. The talk will present the most important of these issues – wrong life expectancy estimate; high and growing heterogeneity of life expectancy; limited applicability of the life-cycle hypothesis for the lowest and highest income tier – and outline policy design options based on own completed and on-going research projects.

About the speaker

Prof. dr. Robert Holzmann is a member of the Austrian Academy of Sciences (Vienna) and holds honorary positions at the University of New South Wales (Sydney) and the University of Malaya (Kuala Lumpur). He currently works on pension, labor market and migration issues, public finance, social policy and demography. Among others he is prize recipient of the Theodor-Körner-Preis, award for promotion of science and art, and Leopold-Kunschak-Preis, award for outstanding work in the field of humanities, social sciences and economics.
